### Friday September 11th

On Friday September 11th, everyone is encouraged to wear something bright or fluorescent while walking or wheeling their way to and from school. Once again, two fine and remarkably valuable trophies will be up for grabs: the much coveted Golden Shoe and Golden Bicycle trophies.

Starting closer to school is encouraged for younger students and those just learning to ride bikes, scooters or skateboards. Parental support is also welcomed in helping students walk or wheel.

As always, your safety and that of others is first and foremost. Student ‘Wheelers’ at KPS may legally use footpaths, but remember, ‘Wheelers’ **give way** to ‘Walkers’, and they walk their ‘wheels’ in school grounds. 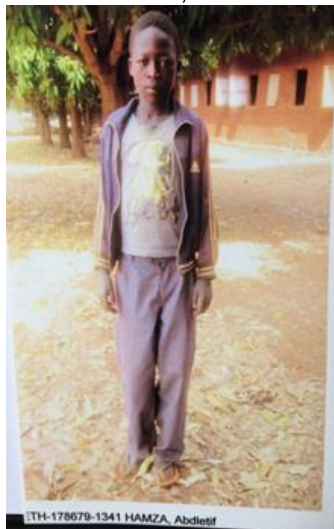
# World Vision
