Principal's Message

A “**Last Post Ceremony**” at the the Australian War Memorial in Canberra on Monday marked the centenary of the declaration of the First World War. This event was attended by the Minister of Veterans’ Affairs, a contingent of ambassadors and high commissioners and, two school students from every State or Territory of Australia. The schools involved were – Campbell High School from the ACT, Glossodia Public School from News South Wales, St Mary’s Catholic Primary School from Queensland, **Kingsville Primary School** from Victoria, Kormilda College from the Northern Territory, Mount Gambier High School from South Australia, Dale Christian School from Western Australia and Devonport High School from Tasmania.

Only 16 students invited to participate in the ceremony and Edith Beattie and Finn Craig from Kingsville year 5 proudly took part. During the ceremony they laid wreaths to symbolise the importance of passing on the ANZAC tradition to future generations. They also wrote messages of thanks, hope and peace on cards provided and these will now be kept permanently at the memorial.

This was a planned event, as some months ago when the Canberra trip was organised we were asked to have two students from Kingsville represent Victoria. It was an opportunity that presented itself as our students would be in Canberra on August 4th and we were delighted to take up on it.

As Principal, I am extremely proud of Edith and Finn and publicly acknowledge the role they played on Monday evening in such an important ceremony. They both represented their families, their school, their fellow students and their state and they did so admirably. Thank you to Dianne Sturrock who organised the nominations and prepared the students for this event, and of course all other staff working with the year 5 students this week.
